**HISTORY ON THE LINE:** World No. 1 **Novak Djokovic** competes at the 2021 US Open for a record-setting 21st Grand Slam men's singles title, which would break a three-way tie with the injured **Roger Federer** and **Rafael Nadal**. If Djokovic wins his fourth US Open title on 12 September, he will become the first men's singles player since **Rod Laver** in 1969 to complete the Grand Slam in a calendar year (Australian Open, Roland Garros, Wimbledon and US Open championships).

**BRAGGING RIGHTS:** Regardless of his result at the 2021 US Open, Djokovic has made Grand Slam history that separates him from Federer and Nadal. Djokovic won the 2016 Roland Garros championship to join Laver and **Don Budge** as the only men to hold the titles of all four Grand Slam events at the same time. The 34-year-old from Serbia added the 2021 Roland Garros title to join Laver and **Roy Emerson** as the only men to win all four Grand Slam events more than once.

**DECADE OF DJOKOVIC:** Djokovic, Federer and Nadal have combined to win 60 of the 72 Grand Slam titles since 2003 Wimbledon. In other words, five out of every six Grand Slam events held over the last 18 years have been won by a member of the *Big Three*. Djokovic's dominance, alone, has stood out since he won 41 straight matches to start the 2011 season.

**PARITY PREVAILS:** Eight different players have won the US Open title in the last 13 years – including first-time Grand Slam champions **Dominic Thiem** (2020), **Marin Cilic** (2014), **Andy Murray** (2012) and **Juan Martin del Potro** (2009). During that same time, the Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon have each been won by four different players.

**GETTING CLOSER:** Thiem is out with an injury after becoming the first Grand Slam men's singles champion born in the 1990s. The No. 2-8 seeds – all 25-and-under – will try to follow in Thiem's footsteps with a first Grand Slam title. No. 2 seed **Daniil Medvedev**, No. 3 seed **Stefanos Tsitsipas** and No. 6 seed **Matteo Berrettini** have lost to Djokovic in Grand Slam finals this season, while No. 4 seed **Alexander Zverev** fell to Thiem in a fifth-set tiebreak for the 2020 US Open title.

**TOUGH STARTS:** Medvedev, Tsitsipas, Zverev and No. 8 seed **Casper Ruud** all open against Grand Slam semi-finalists.

**BEST OF BEST-OF-FIVE:** Medvedev, Tsitsipas and Zverev own outdoor hard-court wins over Djokovic in best-of-three-set matches. However, Djokovic is 35-1 in best-of-five-setters against players born after Thiem on 3 September 1993 (3-0 vs. Medvedev, 2-0 vs. Tsitsipas, 2-0 vs. Zverev). His lone loss was to **Hyeon Chung** in the 2018 Australian Open fourth round.

**NEW NO. 2:** Medvedev forced a fifth set from two sets down before falling to Nadal in the 2019 US Open final. He swept 15 straight sets to reach the 2020 US Open semi-finals, then was undone by the eventual champion Thiem. The 25-year-old Russian returns to New York City as the first Top-2 player not named Djokovic, Federer, Nadal or Murray since 2005.

**OLYMPICS ↔ OPEN:** Zverev enters the US Open on an 11-match win streak, including a comeback victory over Djokovic that denied the No. 1 seed an opportunity at the *Golden Slam*. The 24-year-old German followed gold at the Tokyo Olympics by defeating the 22-year-old Ruud, the 23-year-old Tsitsipas and 23-year-old **Andrey Rublev** for his fifth ATP Masters 1000 title at Cincinnati. Zverev bids to become the second man to sweep Olympic gold and the US Open title in the same season.

**AMERICAN DREAM:** It's been 18 years since **Andy Roddick** won the US Open, marking America's most recent Grand Slam men's singles title. No. 19 seed **John Isner** and No. 22 seed **Reilly Opelka** are among the 21 American men in the 2021 field (22 played at 2020 US Open). They hope to end the longest Grand Slam title drought in their nation's history.

**GOOD COMPANY:** There are 14 Americans in the Top 100 of the FedEx ATP Rankings – the most of any nation for the week of 23 August 2021. The last time that many Americans were in the Top 100 was the week of 22 January 1996, when Grand Slam champions **Pete Sampras**, **Andre Agassi**, **Michael Chang** and **Jim Courier** led the 14 Top-100 Americans.

**SHINING STARS:** Half of the 14 Top-100 Americans had yet to be born the last time that 14 Americans were in the Top 100, including #NextGenATP players **Sebastian Korda**, **Brandon Nakashima** and **Jenson Brooksby**. All three have reached their first ATP Tour final this year, and Korda went on to capture his maiden title at Parma on 29 May. Nakashima will meet Isner in the opening round after defeating him in the Los Cabos semi-finals and losing to him in the Atlanta final.

**USA IS A-OK:** Earlier this summer, Americans were in five ATP Tour finals in as many weeks for the first time since 2005. That year, Americans reached six straight finals leading up to Agassi's runner-up finish at the US Open as a 35-year-old.

- PLANTING THE SEEDS:** Seeds have won 52 of 53 US Open titles during the Open Era (Unseeded Andre Agassi in 1994).
- [1] Novak Djokovic: Open Era-leader in hard-court win % (Djokovic .842, Federer .835, Connors .831, Laver & Lendl .826).
  - [2] Daniil Medvedev: Leads ATP Tour since 2018 in hard-court titles (11), hard-court finals (16) and hard-court wins (140).
