- The 52nd edition of the Nitto ATP Finals – and first in Italy – begins on Sunday with defending champion **Daniil Medvedev** facing first-time qualifier **Hubert Hurkacz** for the third time in 2021 (1-1 head-to-head). Italian hope **Matteo Berrettini** challenges 2018 champion **Alexander Zverev** in a rematch of the Madrid final won by Zverev.
- Turin becomes the 15th different city to host the Nitto ATP Finals and will do so through at least 2025. The year-end finale was most recently held at The O2 in London, which welcomed 12 consecutive editions from 2009-20.
- The Top-4 seeds are all former champions, led by seven-time year-end No. 1 **Novak Djokovic**. Time and again in 2021, Djokovic has broken, equaled or extended records. He has another chance to make history this week. If Djokovic captures his sixth Nitto ATP Finals title, he will tie **Roger Federer** for the most year-end championships.

- Djokovic, 34, bids to become the oldest Nitto ATP Finals champion and the second player to claim the title after turning 30. Federer won his sixth title at 2011 London as a 30-year-old. There is only one player over the age of 25 in the field for the first time since 1993 Frankfurt (**Stefan Edberg**). All seven other players are #NextGenATP alumni, including **Stefanos Tsitsipas**, who won the 2019 Nitto ATP Finals and 2018 Next Gen ATP Finals titles.
- Four former champions are in the Nitto ATP Finals field for the first time since 1994 Frankfurt (Edberg, **Andre Agassi**, **Boris Becker**, **Pete Sampras**). Europeans comprise the entire field for the second time (also in 2019).
- World No. 2 Medvedev (2020), No. 3 Zverev (2018) and No. 4 Tsitsipas (2019) have won the last three editions of the Nitto ATP Finals. Medvedev went 0-3 in 2019 and 5-0 in 2020 at the Nitto ATP Finals, joining Djokovic as the second player to win the title one year after a winless debut and becoming the first to do so undefeated.
- To win the 2020 title, Medvedev beat No. 1 Djokovic, then-No. 2 **Rafael Nadal** and then-No. 3 **Dominic Thiem**. He became the first player in Nitto ATP Finals history to sweep the Top-3 players in the FedEx ATP Rankings.
- Medvedev also became the sixth different Nitto ATP Finals champion in the last six years, repeating a feat from the 1970s. Never have seven different players won the title in seven years. The four players who could make that record a reality are two-time qualifiers Berrettini & **Andrey Rublev** and debutants Hurkacz & **Casper Ruud**.
- Berrettini aims for the 10th Nitto ATP Finals title to be won on home soil and the second since **Lleyton Hewitt** at 2001 Sydney. **Andy Murray** defeated Djokovic for the 2016 London title and to end the year as World No. 1.

- The doubles field is led by the year-end No. 1 team of **Nikola Pietrangeli** and **Mate Pavic**. The Croatians have won nine titles in 12 finals during their first season as a team, but enter Turin with a 3-6 record since their 56-5 start. The Red Group features four teams that have each won multiple Grand Slam titles, including 2019 Nitto ATP Finals champions and 2018 Nitto ATP Finals runners-up **Pierre-Hugues Herbert** and **Nicolas Mahut** of France.

## DANIIL MEDVEDEV

### Nitto ATP Finals History

- Captured 2020 Nitto ATP Finals title with victories over 2018 champion A. Zverev 6-3 6-4, 5-time champion Djokovic 6-3 6-3, Schwartzman 6-3 6-3, 2-time finalist Nadal 3-6 7-6(4) 6-3 and 2019 finalist Thiem 4-6 7-6(2) 6-4.
- Became 1st player in tournament history to defeat World No. 1, No. 2 and No. 3 (d. Djokovic, Nadal and Thiem).
- Also became 2nd Russian champion in tournament history, joining Davydenko at 2009 London.
- Medvedev won last of 12 editions held at The O2 and Davydenko won 1st of 12.
- Five victories at 2020 Nitto ATP Finals were part of career-long 20 match win streak overall (12 vs. Top 10).
- Went 0-3 in Nitto ATP Finals tournament debut in 2019 (l. to Tsitsipas, Nadal and A. Zverev).
- In 2020, became 1st player in tournament history to go undefeated one year after going winless in his debut.
- First Russian to compete at Nitto ATP Finals in at least 3 straight seasons since Davydenko in 2005-09.
- Joined by Rublev for 2nd straight year. Only other Russian duo in same year was Kafelnikov and Safin in 2000.
- Shares birthday with Hurkacz (Medvedev born on 11 February 1996, Hurkacz born on 11 February 1997).

### Career Highlights

- Achieved career-high No. 2 in 2021, becoming 1st Top-2 player not named Djokovic, Nadal, Federer or Murray since No. 2 Hewitt in 2005.
- After falling to No. 2 Nadal in 2019 US Open final and No. 1 Djokovic in 2021 Australian Open final, denied No. 1 Djokovic of calendar Grand Slam by beating him for 2021 US Open title.
- Defeated No. 1 Djokovic, No. 2 Nadal and No. 3 Thiem at 2020 Nitto ATP Finals to become 1st player to sweep Top 3 in tournament history and anywhere on ATP Tour since 2007 Madrid (Nalbandian).
- Won his last 10 matches of 2020 and 1st 10 matches of 2021, including 12 victories against 8 different Top-10 opponents and titles at ATP Masters 1000 Paris, Nitto ATP Finals and ATP Cup.
- Captured 12 of his 13 singles titles on hard courts (6 indoor, 6 outdoor), including ATP Masters 1000 championships at 2019 Cincinnati, 2019 Shanghai, 2020 Paris and 2021 Toronto.

## HUBERT HURKACZ

### Nitto ATP Finals History

- One of 2 players in singles or doubles field who is making his tournament debut (also Ruud).
- Becomes 2nd Polish player to compete in singles at Nitto ATP Finals (also 1976 finalist Fibak).
- Becomes 5th Polish player overall to compete at this event (Fibak, Fyrstenberg, Kubot and Matkowski in doubles).
- One of 7 former #NextGenATP players competing this week in Turin (all except Djokovic).
- One of 5 players in field who competed at Next Gen ATP Finals in Milan (also Medvedev, Tsitsipas, Rublev, Ruud).
- Bids to become 4th straight #NextGenATP alum to win this title (2018 A. Zverev, 2019 Tsitsipas, 2020 Medvedev).

### Career Highlights

- Top Polish men's player in history achieved career-high No. 9 after advancing to 2021 ATP Masters 1000 Paris SF.
- Entered 2021 Wimbledon on 6-match losing streak, then defeated No. 2 Medvedev and 8-time champion Federer en route to 1st Grand Slam SF.
- Upset 5 higher seeds to win biggest of 4 singles titles at 2021 Miami, becoming lowest-ranked ATP Masters 1000 champion as World No. 37 since No. 50 Berdych at 2005 Paris.
- In 2nd event as a team, won 1st ATP Tour doubles title at 2020 ATP Masters 1000 Paris w/Auger-Aliassime.
- Won Brest Challenger title in final week of 2018 ATP Race to Milan to qualify for Next Gen ATP Finals.

## ALEXANDER ZVEREV

### Nitto ATP Finals History

- Making 5th straight appearance – longest active streak and 2nd most appearances among field (Djokovic 14)
- Defeated No. 3 Federer in SF and avenged group loss to No. 1 Djokovic in final to win 2018 championship.
- Became 3rd German to win Nitto ATP Finals title (also Becker in 1988, 1992 and 1995; Stich in 1993).
- Upset No. 1 Nadal en route to 2019 SF, becoming 1st player to beat Djokovic, Nadal & Federer at Nitto ATP Finals.
- With SF spot on the line, lost final group match to No. 1 Djokovic in 2020 and Sock in 2017.
- Won debut at age 20 in 2017 (d. Cilic) and is youngest Nitto ATP Finals match winner since Del Potro, 20, in 2008.

### Career Highlights

- Achieved career-high No. 3 as 20-year-old in 2017, becoming youngest Top-3 player since Djokovic, 20, in 2007.
- Leads all players born in 1990s with 18 tour-level championships, highlighted by wins over World No. 1 Djokovic en route to 2018 Nitto ATP Finals title and 2020 Tokyo Olympics gold medal (held in 2021).
- Reached 1st Grand Slam final at 2020 US Open, rallying from 2-set deficit for 1st time to defeat Carreno Busta in SF before squandering 2-set lead for 1st time against Thiem in final.

### Nitto ATP Finals History

- Aiming for 10th Nitto ATP Finals title to be won on home soil and 2nd since Hewitt in 2001 (also Murray in 2016).
- In 2019, defeated Thiem in his final group match to become 1st Italian to earn a singles win in tournament history.
- Becomes 1st Italian to make multiple appearances (Panatta in 1975, Barazzutti in 1978, Bolelli/Fognini in 2015).
- One of 7 former #NextGenATP players competing this week in Turin (all except Djokovic).
